How in the world has six months flow by so quickly? How can it be 2018 already? As we age, time seems to go by at a faster rate than when we were 12 and "bored" all the time.

Each year I set goals for myself. Some people call these resolutions. No matter what you call them, they are things we set out to do that will hopefully improve who we are a human beings, as individuals, and help us build the kingdom of God.

I don't always meet my goals, but I always strive towards them. If we settle for what is, we do ourselves a disservice. We have the capacity and capability to do more and learn more, but we sell ourselves short by sitting stagnant. John Wesley says, "We are going on to perfection." Not that we will reach it, but that we strive towards.

Last year I set out to run 1000 miles, two half marathons, and work out a minimum of three times a week. I fell short. I only ran 450 miles. I did complete 2 half marathons though, and 80% of the time, I worked out in some fashion three times per week or more. I also set out to read 8 books, and to give more of my money away, which I did. I am not upset by the shortfalls, I am thankful for the progress and can set more realistic goals this year, but I am going to continue to challenge myself.

The problem with most resolutions or goals is that when made, there is no plan to execute them, and thus failure ensues. When setting goals, we need to have plans. With a goal of 500 miles this year, I plan to run approximately ten miles a week, knowing that some weeks I will run more during training, and others I will run slightly less. On an average week I will run three miles, three times per week. I also hope to donate a dollar per mile to UMCOR. I am going to challenge others to sponsor me throughout the year and donate as well.


