

At the beginning of our journey on Ash Wednesday I posed the question to attenders to ask themselves come Easter: "How will I be changed by this journey on Easter morning? How will I be different?"

While this is not a destination but instead a stop on a larger journey, I find myself constantly having a new conversation between my head and my heart that looks something like this:

Head: Oh boy, here we go again...this wasn't planned.

Heart: Yep, but look how good this will be to do.

Head: It will be good. We will learn and grow in this experience.

Heart: We may even encounter God in a new way by letting go

of what we expect or hope for, and embrace the unknown of this situation.

Head: We may indeed. So here we go, stepping into the uncertain with an open mind and heart.

Heart: Here we go – following where we are called, not necessarily where we have planned.


Head: We know a Risen Savior, let's do it! Adventure awaits.

News from Congregational Care

I was recently asked to make a very short video to explain to the confirmation class what our committee does. I explained to them that we have many members of our congregation who we see regularly, and some that we only see from time to time. But there are valued members of our congregation that we do not see in church. These are mostly elderly or infirm members who are more comfortable in their own homes or care center. So Congregational Care takes church to them. We visit regularly, talk about the life of the church, of our families, of current events – anything the homebound member wishes to talk about. We pray with them. We may give them a ride to the doctor or hairdresser. When they are having a bad week we may take in a meal or two. We take communion out to these homes and care centers quarterly. In March we had four teams out taking communion. We have a small script we use, and offer the bread and cup of communion. So many of these members really appreciate it. I'd like to invite any of you to join us when we go out again in June – it will be an uplifting experience. Besides our committee members. I maintain a list of other members who have told me they would be willing to do any of these tasks from time to time, and I call on them when needed. If you feel you could help out in this way occasionally (once or twice a year), please let me know. WE HAVE A SPOT FOR YOU. We are Christ's hands and feet in this place. Perhaps you know some of these members who appreciate our visits and/or communion. Please remember these folks in your prayers. Cards and calls are always appreciated also.
