

Pastor Lisa's Lines

It was a happy day on Wall Street, Oct. 9, 2007, the DOW Jones Industrial Average hit a new all-time high, 14,164.53. By the end of the week it had slipped a bit, closing at 14,093.08.

Few people at that moment realized that during the next year and a half, on March 9th of 2009, it would crash to a low of 6,547.05, a 54% loss.

Fewer people on that date would have predicted that on September 21, 2018, nearly ten years later, the DOW would reach a new high and climb past it's old record highs...and this was just last week!

So, it begs the question, are you happier now than you were when it hit bottom in 2009?

When it all crashed and burned in 2008-9, people lost more than a few thousand points on the DOW. It is hard to quantify, but there is little connection between how you feel about CitiBank losing tens of billions of dollars, and your sister or brother losing their jobs and then their home.

While the economy has recovered to a much better place, and we are financially better off for the most part, if we are investing well, we still aren't happy. Even if we aren't investors, if we are looking at our paycheck and the financial situation for the country as a whole, we are mostly better off than we were when the recession hit ten years ago.

But we aren't happy. We are more despondent, dispirited, and depressed than be-

fore. After each war in history, church attendance has increased. After 9/11, any major school shooting, or national crisis, we have seen church attendance increase...except for the last 10 years. After 2009, the recent recession hit, and we saw church attendance decline even more.

As we worry more and more about our physical well-being, we spend less and less time worrying about our spiritual well-being. As we worry more and more about our housing values, we spend less and less time worrying about our personal values. As we worry more about our government's intransigence and unwillingness to reconcile to save the country, we worry less about our own spiritual transgressions and our unwillingness to reconcile with the living God.

This October the sermon series will address these concerns. We need to turn to the good shepherd who can lead us to green pastures. We can only find true happiness when we follow the teachings of Jesus. It is time to turn back to God. I hope you will make it a point to attend this series every week. I hope you will share with your friends and neighbors who might be feeling unhappy with life, maybe even "harassed and helpless," that there is help to be found.

Fall Sermon Series: Happiness Can be Yours: Discovering the Simple Joys that can Change Your Life.

I believe God wants us to be happy, so come find out how to find your happiness again.

Our second monthly meeting is October 15, and our program will be led by Stanley Hayes, who will share highlights of two different service projects he participated in during this past year.



BOARD OF TRUSTEES – SEPTEMBER 2018 SUMMARY

Hello to All of MUMC members and friends,

Our Board met on September 11th. A Somber time to be sure and Yvonne gave a beautiful Devotion. It seems that hardly no one was left unscathed as a result of this event. But, we bounce back with God's Grace and endeavor to be better and stronger.


So, what has the Board of Trustees (BOT) been up to? The September meeting was a month to reflect and summarize what has been done thus far. The BOT has spent over \$109 thousand dollars on construction projects. The money has come from the extra contributions from the congregation, our own Building and Maintenance Fund, and financial support from the Finance Committee. The Board is still emotionally absorbing the generosity of the Church and Finance Committee. However, we have depleted our Building Maintenance Funds as well. So, we are praying for a calm winter.

The various construction projects are as follows: we replaced windows in the basement to make the Children's and Basement area more secure, an unexpected water main break led to a significant expenditure, we upgraded our basement bathrooms to be ADA Compliant. Oddly enough, the basement bathrooms were the only planned project.

Some of the things that we are looking forward to accomplishing: Reviewing the Building Use Policy, reviewing the Administration Policy for the BOT, Budget the Oak Doors for renovation, Safety and Security Policy review, reviewing our Long-Range Funds and reinvesting them for the Future. The Tables of Opportunity was a success. We had a couple of folks thinking about serving on the BOT in the future. Please talk to Pastor Lisa about service and talk to present BOT members to hear about the month to month activities. It is a chance to see the maintenance side of the Church, delve into the past History to understand how we approach the future, and understand how we fit into the Church government. Please come to a meeting to see us in action. You will not regret it, I certainly haven't.
