- "Reading the Bible Again for the First Time" by Marcus





Thailand Methodist Mission

HUMAN TRAFFICING IS A WORLD-WIDE PROBLEM. Itis estimated 2 to 4 million per-

sons are added annually. From 2003 to 2006, child trafficking cases made up approximately 20 percent of all human trafficking cases. Statistics from 2007 to 2010, show that this percentage increased to 27 percent. Approximately 1/3 of these children are male and 2/3 are female and the youngest ages for sex trafficking range from 11 to 15 years old.

THAILAND IS ONE OF THE CENTERS FOR THIS ACTIVITY. Thailand is a major tourist destination in Asia. Each year, millions visit the major cities like Bangkok, with a large percentage going for "Sex Tourism and Drugs". In addition, many of the human trafficking victims are exported to countries all over the world including the U.S. In Thailand, it is estimated that 2 children enter the human trafficking pipelines every minute and one of the key centers for this activity is Pattaya.

POVERTY AND CULTURAL NORMS ADD TO THIS ACTIVITY. One major driving force for this activity is that, in Thai society, children are responsible for taking care of their parents. This duty usually falls onto the shoulders of the youngest unmarried daughter. Many uneducated, rural women find that working in the sex industry is the best way to do so, and they move to more metropolitan areas. Once there, they are unable to leave because they usually do not have other job options.


THAILAND METHODIST MISSION WORKS TO STEM THE FLOW. The Thailand Methodist Mission currently supports Four Blessing Homes. The first was established in Pattaya with Blessing Homes in Issan, TaPharaya, and Korat added later. The staff of these homes work with local congregations to identify children who are at risk of becoming part of the human trafficking system. They provide safe homes, Christian education, food, clothing, medicine and all other things that are needed until these children graduate from high school.

YOU CAN HELP. Your prayers on behalf of the Thailand Methodist Mission can and do make a difference. Financial gifts are also appreciated. The needs of one child can be met with only \$500 per year.
