on Christmas to open presents and celebrate the birth of Christ.

It will be St. George that will now hold holiday memories for me and the time spend with my siblings, their spouses and all my nieces and nephews.



If you would like for the Bakers to order the <u>UPPER ROOM DISCIPLINE</u>.

<u>Daily Devotional</u> book, we will need your order by Sunday, December 1, 2019. If you place your own order, it will cost you\$14.99 plus shipping (about \$4.00). When we order for you the cost will be determined by how many books we order. We get a 20% discount for ordering 25 books, and we get a 25% discount for ordering fifty or more books. Bulk mailing also gets the shipping down to about a dollar each.

This is not the small Daily Devotional that the church purchases. Some groups use these books for study, many people use their own for a personal devotional. There is a weekly theme, and scriptures for the week. One author writes on the weekly theme. We think they are powerful materials. Order: 249-3735.

You do not pay until after we receive the bulk mailing when we know the total bill, but probably \$12-13 per book.

### **Online Giving**

Online giving to the church is available through our web site, www.montroseumc.org, and by texting to (970) 475-8575.

Using our web site, select "GET IN TOUCH" and then "GIVING." This will take you to a page with a form to fill out. Enter how much you would like to give and then choose either "Credit Card or ACH Transfer from your back account. By default the money you give will go into the General Fund through the account "41001 Envelopes and Tithes." You have the option to choose another account with a drop-down menu. You have the option to choose "one time gift" or, with a drop-down menu, a recurring gifts of "weekly," "every 2 weeks," "monthly," or" yearly." You will be sent a receipt by email.

When you text to (970) 475-8575 the first time you will be prompted to enter your payment detail, either a credit card or bank account from which to give. Breeze, our church wide computer management program, will remember your payment information, so the next time you want to give simply enter the amount and send. The default is to give to the General Fund. If you want to give to another fund, enter the amount followed by one of the following keywords:

### **News from your Missions Committee**

Each year the Missions Committee selects worthy recipients to receive the Advent Offering. The recipients include one national/international group and one local group. This year the national/international recipient is our very own United Methodist Committee on Relief (UMCOR)—International, focusing on the Bahamas. Many people living on some of the Islands of the Bahamas islands lost everything in recent hurricanes. The Bahamas Methodist Church is being assisted by UMCOR to provide assistance to those in need. The local recipient is The Helping Hand Fund, A Private Foundation. It was started by Dr. Mary Vader 10 years ago to assist people with financial needs not covered by any other source. This fund has given: gas cards to people who need to drive to Denver for medical help; purchased special shoes; purchased a bed and bedding for a mother; provided dental work; purchased a car seat; built a ramp for a stroke victim; and purchased gun locks, carbon monoxide (CO) detectors, and smoke alarms for anyone in the community. The fund encourages recipients to "pay it forward" and help others in any way possible. The Helping Hand Fund is run by a board of local community members.

If you want a specific recipient to receive your donation, just indicate that on your check in the memo line that the donation is for Advent and a specific recipient. Otherwise, your donation will be divided between the two recipients.

The Missions Committee would like to thank all of those who bought pecans. The proceeds from the pecan sales will be divided between the Kids' Aid Program and the Pastor's Discretionary Fund. The Kids' Aid Program provides food for the weekends for those students who might not otherwise have any food at home for them while they are not at school. The Pastor's Discretionary Fund provides bus passes and monetary assistance for various purposes, like propane heat and paying for prescriptions.
