Pastor Lisa's Lines

For the past few weeks we have been sitting in our homes, we have been missing one another. We have been waiting for the day when we can safely, without worry of harm for ourselves or others, go outside and hug people outside of our household. We are eagerly anticipating a day when we are able to greet one another with the Peace of Christ with a high-five, or a handshake.

If you are like me, you may be longing to see your friends, familiar faces and feeling the genuine warmth of another person outside your home.

As I sit in my house and frantically respond to email (I have about 105 emails just this morning) and have meetings with other clergy in our district and with our staff from church, I also have a deep longing for connection with each of you.

A friend of mine in a "meeting" last week gave me this beautiful idea for prayer and I pass it on as a way for us to stay connected: Pray the directory.

Wait, what? Yes, pray the directory. If you don't have a current church directory, email or call Sheila or Rachael in the office and we will figure out how to get you a current copy. But whatever copy you have will work too.

I sat last week and I looked at each name in our directory and prayed for each person. Some of you I know things that are going on in your lives and I prayed for those specifically.

Others of you, I don't know well or have only talked to in passing in a greeting on Sunday mornings as you come and go. And for you, I pray that whatever is on your heart, God be present and persistent with hope.

This is a way I can stay connected with each of you from a distance. When you need me, I hope you call me. When you don't need me, I hope you know I am still praying for you. You are beautiful people of God that have been placed in my care. I take this seriously.

As we begin our Holy Week journey from our own spaces, I want to tell you three things.

1. I love you. If I have failed you, please know that I am deeply sorry for the hurt I have caused you. I ask your forgiveness as a pastor who is only human.

- 2. God love you. Wherever you find yourself as you read this, and through whatever is going on in your life, God is loving you through it. I hope you feel it and know it in your bones. The story of Holy week is the reminder that God's love cannot be escaped. There is no sin grand enough, nor dispute big enough that can keep God from loving you, not even death.
- 3. This community of faith loves you. I have seen it and I know it. These people we call the church, are loving you and praying for you. When you need one of them, call them. When you think of one of them, write them. The church may not be in the building, but the church is at work in the world. We have been commissioned and sent forth. This community is working and is loving you.

Friends, I miss you and await the day when we will be together in person to say, "Christ is Risen!" together! For this is true no matter if we are together or apart. CHRIST IS RISEN! I love you and miss you,

How to Join Worship on Sunday mornings:

We go live at 8:15, but you can log in to watch anytime after 9:15 a.m. to watch the recording afterwards.

- 1. Open a web browser on your tablet, phone or computer
- 2. Copy and paste this address into your search bar: http://www.facebook.com/montroseumc.org
- 3. You'll see the church picture at the top of the page and you will need to use your mouse to scroll down till you see our video
- 4. If you don't have a facebook account, you'll just have a bar at the bottom of the screen prompting you to make an account or sign in. You DO NOT have to do this in order to watch the video. Just scroll up so you can see the video and the prompt bar will stay at the bottom of your screen.
- 5. Don't forget to mail in your offering to the office (19. S. Park Avenue, Montrose CO. 81401) Yes, we are still going by to get the mail. -or- log on to our giving page and give online at:

HOW TO JOIN A ZOOM MEETING

To join a Zoom meeting via the internet you will need a computer, tablet or smartphone that is connected to the internet and has a camera, speaker and microphone.



To join a meeting, simply follow these steps:

- 1. Click the link that was provided to you to join the meeting. The link will be something similar to https://zoom.us/j/606913802. (This is a sample, and NOT your link.)
- 2. You will be prompted to download and run Zoom. The zoomusLauncher.zip file will download.
- 3. Click on the file and you can install the launcher.
- 4. The Zoom meeting window will appear where you can join your audio and connect your video.
- 5. Select 'Join Audio Conference by Computer' to join the audio.
- 6. To connect the video select the video camera icon in the bottom left hand corner (or top right) of the Zoom meeting window. You should now be connected to the Zoom meeting with video and audio.

During the meeting, if you are not speaking, you may wish to mute yourself. This will help eliminate background noise for everyone. Your meeting host can also mute and unmute you. To mute or unmute yourself click on the microphone icon. (When a slash is across the microphone you are muted and people on the Zoom meeting cannot hear you.)




New Way to Do Bible Study, Classes and Meetings Coming Soon!

YOU DO NOT have to download this to be a part of a call/meeting. However it might be helpful. For each "gathering" a host, myself or someone from the church will send out an email or text invitation to join the call. If you don't have an account the simplest way to join is to click the link provided in the email and if needed to copy and paste the meeting ID number.

Board of Trustees Action

At the March Board of Trustees meeting, the Trustees voted to purchase an AED, Automatic External Defibrillator. The purchase includes a wall cabinet, a double sided sign, CPR responder kit, carrying case, adult pads, pediatric pads.

The Trustees will be applying for a grant from the Endowment Trust Fund Committee and from the Mountain Sky United Methodist Foundation. Both grants will cover the cost of the AED package. As soon as both grants are secured, the order will be placed.

The AED cabinet will be mounted in a location where the AED will be easily accessible for use in the sanctuary or Baldridge Hall.

The Trustees are working with the hospital to have someone provide training after we are allowed to use the church.



Salvation Army Food Boxes

A message from Nathan Garner. He and his family have moved to Grand Junction so that they can find better services for Nathan, a disabled adult. He currently is working at Salvation Army assembling food boxes. He wanted us to know that some of those boxes are brought to Montrose. Even though the retail side of the building is closed, there is an office for assistance and food boxes, as well as utility help, can be requested there. Another avenue of help and support is available and not widely advertised.

Cedar Creek Church

Has food boxes. there is no limit and people in need can go pick up boxes Mondays, Thursdays and Saturdays from 9a.m. to 12 p.m.


