Our founder, John Wesley had three simple rules he lived by: "Do no harm. Do Good. Stay in Love with God." We are anxious to reopen our doors, but not at the harm of anyone in our community.





The United Methodist Church recognizes returning to full participation will be based on the oversight of the Office of the Bishop, Crisis Response Team, state and national guidelines, as well as the seasonal movement of the virus. It is our hope you will read through this document, allowing it to guide the response of our local faith community.

<u>Level 3—Stay in Love with God: Red Light Status:</u> Stop all non-critical gatherings. Essential workers only. This is the "Stay in Love with God" and stay home phase of our ministry. Right now it is best to err on the side of distancing even as we have received new guidelines from the Colorado Governor's Office.

<u>Level 2– Do Good: Yellow Light Status:</u> Cautionary Return. We anticipate this will cover a number of months. As the Coloradans and Montrose County residence and the people of Montrose United Methodist Church, we want to "Do Good" as restrictions are lifted. This means a gradual return to gatherings and doing so in a cautionary manner.

Level 1—Do No Harm: Green Light Status: When we finally reach the "Do No Harm" phase—it will be because the virus is contained and our people are safe. Permission will be granted to all our study groups, youth gatherings, council meetings and Sunday morning worshiping community to return to full activity and other mass gatherings will be permitted. This will be in place only as church leadership is confident in the care of their community of faith and in following our Governor and Mountain Sky Conference guidelines. In the hope that something changes and we can host some of our programs, at a later date, we will get information out to families at that time, but for now everything is cancelled.

We are still waiting on information about Grand Mesa Methodist Camp, which is hosted in July for Elementary School, Middle School, High School, Young Adult, and Family Camps. We will update you all when that information is posted from the Camp Coordinating Committee and Camp Trustees.

I have been a part of MUMC going on 5 years now and the heartache of not providing summer experiences is real and strongly felt. But, in the end, it comes down to the safety and well-being of us all. So we are hoping those who are crafters might use some of their "stay at home" time to create items to donate to the UMW table to help us out.


We will start receiving donations in September so they can be priced.

HOW TO JOIN A ZOOM MEETING

To join a Zoom meeting via the internet you will need a computer, tablet or smartphone that is connected to the internet and has a camera, speaker and microphone.



To join a meeting, simply follow these steps:

- 1. Click the link that was provided to you to join the meeting. The link will be something similar to https://zoom.us/j/606913802. (This is a sample, and NOT your link.)
- 2. You will be prompted to download and run Zoom. The zoomusLauncher.zip file will download.
- 3. Click on the file and you can install the launcher.
- 4. The Zoom meeting window will appear where you can join your audio and connect your video.
- 5. Select 'Join Audio Conference by Computer' to join the audio.
- 6. To connect the video select the video camera icon in the bottom left hand corner (or top right) of the Zoom meeting window. You should now be connected to the Zoom meeting with video and audio.

MUTE AND UNMUTE

During the meeting, if you are not speaking, you may wish to mute yourself. This will help eliminate background noise for everyone. Your meeting host can also mute and unmute you. To mute or unmute yourself click on the microphone icon. (When a slash is across the microphone you are muted and people on the Zoom meeting cannot hear you.)

TEST OUT ZOOM

We are currently using a platform online called ZOOM, which allows people from all over to be on the phone and internet to see and hear one another. For each "gathering" a

host, myself or someone from the church will send out an email or text invitation to join the call. If you don't have a zoom account (they are free), the simplest way to join is to click the link provided in the email and if needed to copy and paste the meeting ID number.
