Pastor Lisa's Lines

Typically, when we get to November, the second-to-last month of the year, we think of all the things we are grateful and thankful for. We begin the month with All Saints Day, a celebration of giving thanks for those we have lost this past year. We spend the month thinking of more things and get to Thanksgiving with a whole list.

This year, more than most, I am thankful for this community of faith. YOU are amazing! The ways you continue to wrestle with the Biblical text and constantly seek Jesus' grace in guiding your understanding of love for all neighbors.

God has given us a vision to look at our buildings. And, while this may bring pause for many of you, let me share with you the process within the United Methodist Church that we use. WE cannot do anything without first forming a Building Committee – a group of people who will spend time, energy and money, FIRST to look at our current structures. This committee will take stock of what we have, possibly hire a structural engineer to assess our structures and tell us what we are working with first. We cannot make any sound decisions about changing anything without first knowing more about our beautiful space. Hiring a structural engineer will take funds that are not in the yearly budget, but will be needed in moving forward.

After an assessment of our structures, then and ONLY then can the committee look at moving forward. If the assessment shows we need to sure up our foundation, then this is great information to have in order to save our structure. If the assessment shows that our structure is sound, but needs a bit of cosmetic work, then this is great information to have in order to know that we can proceed

with... whatever the church wants to do!

I have never been more thankful for the people of this congregation who remain faithful to being Christ to the world, sharing this message of unconditional love. I have never been more thankful for the people of God who hear the call of Jesus and "go!"

This year has not been without its challenges and discouragements; it has not been without its heartbreaks and loss; but it has also held joy and thanksgiving, grace and new perspective, and the love of God outpoured.

At the beginning of December, we will have a Charge Conference held online and in person. At this executive meeting we will take a vote on whether to form a building committee or not. It is my deep desire that you will continue to pray for this church and this community, and for God to show us and guide us as we look at being His church for the next century and beyond.

Thanks be to God for each one of you! Happy Thanksgiving! May each one of you, your families and loved ones be safe and well this holiday season.



2020 Advent Devotional


