

### Relaunching Sanctuary Worship

The Relaunch Team has met every week for months, and our comprehensive plan is now approved by the District Superintendent! It is with great excitement and slight hesitation that we let you know of our plans to re-enter the building for worship on Sunday mornings.

This is a beautiful opportunity for us to continue our love of our neighbor and fellow congregants. Some people are still not able, due to safety concerns, to leave their house and be among many people. Some people are desperate to be able to be in a safe space and worship as they have not been able to worship for 6 months due to lack of online access and/or tripping hazards in the park.

We are asking that you take into consideration ways you ARE able to worship and allow those who have NOT been able to worship to register first for a space in the building.



- There will only be one worship service at 8:45 a.m., with a maximum capacity of 50 people.
- Temperature will be taken for each person prior to entering the building.
- Name and information/attendance will be taken at the doors.
- You'll be escorted to a seat to sit in for worship (Ushers will choose for you).
- Masks must be worn over the nose and mouth while in the building.
- Your cooperation to abstain from contact with other people before, during and after worship is appreciated.
- We will not greet with handshakes, but just nods and waves.
- We will not sing during worship.
- We will listen to beautiful music provided.
- We will spend time in contemplative prayer.
- We will not take prayer requests verbally, but will allow you a drop basket to place written prayers.
- We will have communion, but it will look and feel different.

With ALL of this in mind, we'll ask that if you'd like to attend IN-PERSON worship, perhaps you'll think about registering every-other week. This will allow space for those who really can't worship online for technological reasons.

Thanks in advance for the ways you continue to care for one another and this community. We are faithful together, no matter how and where we gather.



#### **Update from the Vision 2025 Committee**

Dear Congregation,



The Vision 2025 Committee has been work-

ing with many of you since Fall of 2019 to collect ideas and goals for the next five years. We identified the following Vision, Mission, and Values statement which guided the committee in coming up with a strategy table.

Vision (Desired Outcome)

"Montrose United Methodist Church is a leader in being fully inclusive, loving, and just servants of Christ."

Mission (What We Plan to do)

"Joyfully to Love All, Serve All, and Share Jesus Christ with the World"

Values (Foundation for Vision)

- Grow spiritually individually and as a church
- Inclusivity
- Provide musical diversity and excellence
- Provide and maintain a downtown historic building for worship and other gatherings
- Multi-generational ministry
- Mission oriented locally, regionally, and internationally
- Provide fellowship, a sense of belonging, and a support system
- Participate in service projects
- Support a strong youth/family program
- Community oriented
- Fiscally sound

Based on these statements, we identified 11 strategies for us to focus. The Vision 2025 Committee brought it to the Church Council during a special meeting in August. After much discussion and a few edits, the Strategy was adopted unanimously. The Strategy Table is available on our website and in the church office. It outlines the strategy, tactics, the committee in charge of leading the effort, other committees to help and a proposed timeline.

Some of the tactics are new and will require development and/or new committees. Some of the tactics are what we are currently doing and wish to maintain, develop further or change. Items listed above the blue line are tactics important to the entire congregation. Items below the blue line are also important and we want to make sure they do not disappear but did not rise to the same level as the tactics listed above the line.

#### 100 YEARS IN THE SANCTUARY!



In December this year, we will celebrate 100 years of this congregation worshipping in the Sanctuary. As Pastor Lisa pointed out in her sermon on September 13th, it was a condemned building that led the congregation, at the time, to seek a new building project. It would be nearly a decade from the time the congregation left their old building till the cornerstone would be laid in 1918 and another 2 years till the sanctuary was complete.

Pastor Lisa shared with us the vision God has given her to look at the ways we might start thinking about the Sanctuary and all our building space, in order to

serve the community for another 100 years!

Over the past few weeks questions have been rolling in and in an effort to help the congregation start this work of thinking and praying. Pastor Lisa has shared a few questions to ponder:

- How is God calling us to live into our 2025 strategic plan with our adopted vision to be, "fully inclusive, loving, and just servants of Christ"?
- How best can we serve the community and congregation right now?
- How will we commit to this congregation to ensure the next 100 years of worship can take place in this space?
- How will we be good stewards of the church building we've been entrusted with?

At this time, Pastor Lisa is asking each of us to pray for and about the future of this church, the community of faith, and our structures, as well as the ways we are called to serve this community we dearly love.

There are LOTS of things to consider as we move forward, but in order to move forward, even in assessing our structures, we'll need to take a church vote. This will come in December at Charge Conference. Until then, please continue to pray.

No matter what we decide as a church, we remain faithful to God's call to be servants of love and grace for the next 100 years! Thank you for being faithful to this call!
